Fake news refers to deliberate untruths, or stories that contain some truth but which aren't completely accurate, by accident or design.

Fake news can have a negative impact on business and workplace behavior. It can damage learning culture, causing rumor and mistrust to spread. So, it's vital to know how to separate the real from the fake.

You can do this by following these seven steps:

1. Develop a critical mindset.
2. Check the source.
3. See who else is reporting the story.
4. Examine the evidence.
5. Check that proper consultations were done.
6. Don't take images at face value.
7. Check that it "sounds right."
